*Presider* Alleluia. Christ is risen.

*People* **The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia.**

### CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

*Stand or kneel*

*The presider first reads one of the sentences from the Book of Common Prayer, pp.351-352, then says,

*On festive occasions, the confession may be omitted*
