OPENING ACCLAMATION

Presider Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins.

People **God's mercy endures for ever. Amen.**

The presider first reads the sentence at the top of p.352 of the Book of Common Prayer, then says

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor
