Welcome! This morning, the Rev. Dr. Barrie Bates preaches and presides. Our musician is Sal Page. We continue our series on modern Anglican saints (or people who *should be* recognized as saints!), today hearing a bit about the Most Rev. Desmond Tutu, Archbishop of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa, 1986-1994.

Spotlight on Hymnody: “Ye servants of God, your Master proclaim” is the first of numerous *Hymns for Times of Trouble and Persecution* by Charles Wesley. Although we think of him and his brother John as the founders of Methodism, both were ordained priests in the Church of England and remained so throughout their lifetime. (Did you know they were but 2 of 19 siblings?!) The tune PADERBORN appeared in print as early as 1742, and our hymnal includes harmony composed by Sir Sydney Nicholson, the founder of the Royal School of Church Music, in 1927.

Who Knew? In the past, to be a member of the Anglican Communion was to be in communion with the Archbishop of Canterbury. Under the leadership of Rowan Williams, that definition was broadened to include four “Instruments of Unity”—the ABC, the Primates’ Council, the Lambeth Conference, and the Anglican Consultative Council. When Dame Sarah Mullally was elected Archbishop of Canterbury, just last year, about half the communion declared they would have nothing to do with her and were now the “Global Anglican Communion” or “GAFCON.” While the dust is still settling, it appears there are now two groups asserting to be Anglican, one of which has no ties with England. We in the Episcopal Church remain loyal to the traditional Anglican Communion—and accepting of the ordained ministry of women. (There’s a picture of Archbishop Sarah in our vestibule.)
